> Implementation Guide for the Sixth Tooth Celebration

Objective of the Program

To raise awareness among first-grade students and their parents about the importance of the first permanent molar ("tooth 6") through engaging, culturally appropriate educational activities delivered by trained health professionals and volunteers.

Target Population

• Students: All first-grade children in public and private primary schools

- Parents: At least one parent or guardian invited to attend the school session
- Facilitators: PHC personnel, school health workers, dental students, dental assistants, private-sector dentists, and community health volunteers

Recommended Timeline

- Program Week: November 24–30, 2024 (coinciding with Iran's National Oral Health Week)
- Preparation Period: October–mid-November 2024
- Reporting Window: December 1–15, 2024

Preparatory Steps

- Training of facilitators via workshops and webinars (see Appendix B)
- Finalization and dissemination of educational materials (see Appendices C, D)
- Coordination with school administrators to secure time slots and space
- Technical checks (availability of AV equipment or alternative tools such as dentics/posters)

Materials Required

- Slide deck or printed educational posters (Appendix C)
- Tooth model or illustrative props
- Educational poem, song recording, and posters (Appendix D)
- Attendance sheets, documentation devices (camera or smartphone)
- Evaluation forms (Appendices E and L)

Session Structure in Schools

Each school event should ideally include the following five components:

- 1. Opening: Welcome remarks by the school principal or facilitator
- 2. Parental Education (~15–20 minutes): Visual presentation of key messages about the sixth tooth
- 3. Student Engagement:
 - Group recital of the poem
 - Creative activities (drawing, crafting, model-making)
 - Optional student-led performance or play
- 4. Interactive Q&A: With parents and students
- 5. Closing: Appreciation and group photo (if permitted)

Documentation and Reporting

- Use the standardized Excel reporting template (Appendix G)
- Collect photos, short video clips, and summary notes per school (with consent)
- Submit materials to Tabriz Vice-Chancellor of Health; for aggregation and quality review.
- reported to Ministry of Health

Evaluation Tools

- Facilitator satisfaction surveys (Appendix E)
- Parent awareness questionnaires (Appendix L, for selected schools)
- Verbal and written feedback from school staff and trainers (see Appendix H)

Tips for Successful Delivery

- Tailor content delivery to school capacity (with or without AV tools)
- Train facilitators to address FAQs, especially on fluoride and tooth eruption
- Collaborate with school teachers to optimize planning
- Encourage active, age-appropriate participation from students
- Maintain cultural sensitivity and ensure inclusive participation
